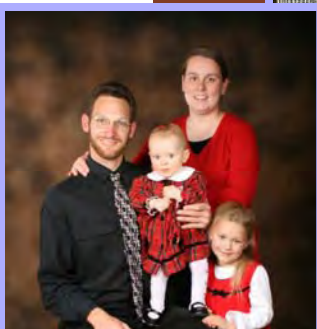

Glazed Carrots

- 1 small onion
- 3 slices bacon
- 3 tablespoons brown sugar
- 1/4 cup orange juice
- 1/8 teaspoon black pepper
- 2 cans carrots

Chop onion. In a large skillet, cook bacon until crisp; remove from skillet. Reduce heat and sauté onion in bacon drippings. Add brown sugar, orange juice and pepper; blend well. Stir in carrots. Cook until thoroughly heated. Sprinkle with crumbled bacon. (Also good without onion.)

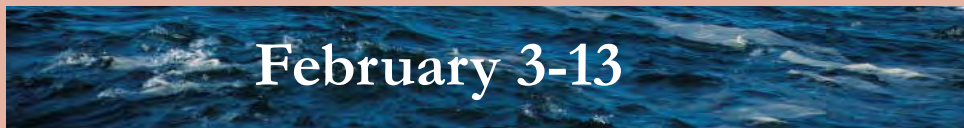
