

## A New Church in Fort Myers

By nature transitions take place over a course of time. Some are short, and some take longer than others. Recently our Spanish church in Fort Myers, Florida, has been undergoing a rather long transition. About six years ago we started looking for

land on which to build a permanent home for this growing body of believers. At that time our congregation of around one hundred individuals was meeting in a small room at the Fort Myers Rescue Mission. We realized a change had to be made and after much searching were able to purchase nearly five acres of land in the heart of the Hispanic population of Fort Myers. For us, transition had begun.

From the very beginning, this project included the whole church with forty or fifty young men working together to clear the jungle that made up our property. The church building fund started to grow as now there was action taking place. Excitement was in the air! Plans were drawn for a new sanctuary. Volunteers from Mission Helps and Hearts and Hands Ministries came forward with offers to help in the construction. After leading us to the right parcel of land, God also led us to the engineers and contractors who could help make this change a reality.

I have heard stories of building projects that divided churches. But with this project, God was leading a congregation not only growing in number but also in excitement as they saw Him working on their behalf. Change can be a unifying event when God is in it.

Finally the day came when the pastor had the privilege of laying the first block—the cornerstone for the new church. By this time the congregation had grown to around two hundred people, and only lack of space was holding us back from further growth.

Volunteer groups arrived to work alongside the church men, and the walls and roof went up in just seven days. The ladies of the church supported by preparing hearty meals for the workers.

God was not just building a new structure. The church members have come through this time as a closer congregation and are now transitioning from the construction phase to focus on evangelism as they seek to fill their new church.

I feel blessed to have been able to work with Pastor Rigoberto, his team, and all the volunteers from start to finish on this project. As we leave the old building and enter the new, it is clear that God has led us through this transition time.

## Letter from President-Elect Martin

For nearly fourteen years I have been serving at Missionary Flights International (MFI) in Fort Pierce, Florida. It has been a rewarding ministry under which to serve, and we certainly have not been looking for opportunities to serve elsewhere. MFI is making a tremendous impact in the Caribbean region, and it has been a privilege to be a part of such an incredible ministry. I have prayed many times over the years, however, that if God ever wanted to move our family to another ministry, He would need to open the doors He wanted us to walk through, and He would need to make it very clear to us.

I can say without hesitation that this prayer has been answered over the past several months. The philosophy that Kayla and I have used in discerning God's will throughout our married life has been quite simple. We pray, seek advice from godly council, and walk through the doors that open easily.

## **CULTURAL CONNECTIONS**

Komania

omania is full of quaint villages where at least forty-five percent of the population still resides. Most of these villages have properties surrounded by some sort of fencing and situated on either side of a dirt road. Behind these fences is typically found a small dwelling, along with a garden and numerous trees that produce all kinds of fruits and vegetables. Many people also have livestock, which usually includes at least one cow, several pigs, geese, goats, turkeys and a clutch of chickens for both meat and egg production.

During the day, the majority of the smaller animals roam on the roads, grazing freely at their leisure. It is common to come in contact with a neighbor's fowls and livestock on a regular basis. Quite often, one can see a flock of sheep being led through the village by a shepherd and his faithful dogs. Every morning, it is not abnormal to see a large number of cows heading off to pasture, accompanied by one of the villagers. As these cows march down the street, at each house another one slowly joins the group as they make their way to the fields. When the sun begins to set, these same cows return unsupervised back into the village and to their respective dwellings. Bicycles and horse-drawn carts are the preferred mode of transportation, and many still rely on the village well to obtain their drinking water.

It is true that when you enter many of Romania's villages, it feels as if you are literally stepping back in time. For some a village lifestyle may seem a bit antiquated. However, for the ministry with which Hope International Missions is involved, a village setting has



proven to be an ideal place. It has allowed our missionaries to teach children from the House of Hope orphanage the benefit of hard work and responsibility. It has also provided opportunities to cultivate relationships with the young people from the village through the activities at HIM's Fellowship Center. Through these relationships the gospel message is shared on a regular basis. Our prayer is that many will become disciples of Jesus through this work.

Romanian traditional food is quite rich and features simple but delicious meals. Meatballs of various types are an integral part of this cuisine. Chiftele (Romanian meatballs) is one such traditional meat dish. Chiftele can be served as an appetizer or as a main course and is enjoyed with marinara sauce, mustard, sour cream, or other dips.



## Chiftele (Romanian Meatballs)

A traditional recipe of Romania provided by Sally Sebo

Prep time: 20 mins

Cook time: 30 mins

#### **INGREDIENTS**

- 1 tbsp vegetable oil1 large or 2 small onions, finely chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, finely minced 2 medium potatoes grated
- 2 lb ground pork
- 2 eggs
- 2 eggs
  ½ cup bread crumbs
  ¼ cup parsley, finely chopped
  ¼ cup dill, finely chopped
  salt and pepper to taste
  oil for frying

Makes 6–8 servings.

#### HOW TO MAKE CHIFTELE


- In a skillet add the tablespoon of oil and sauté the onions and garlic until tender. Add the grated potato and cook until tender. Let this cool.
- In a large bowl add the remaining ingredients to the onion/potato blend and mix well.
- 3. Form into balls or the traditional small patties.
- 4. Heat frying oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat. Once the oil is hot, place the meatballs in the oil and fry them for 3-4 minutes on each side or until they are crispy brown.
- 5. When done transfer the meatballs to a paper towel lined plate or a wire rack. Serve fresh and warm.

**Tip:** Romanian meatballs can also be baked at 400 °F for 30 to 45 minutes or until cooked through.

## HIM Europe Expands into Slovakia



every year approximately 400 young people graduate from the state-run orphanages in Slovakia and are forced to make it on their own. Many of these have nowhere to go, no job, and no one to help them.

God has given HIM a vision for assisting orphans as they make their transition from these orphanages to independent living. Often, because the young people have no knowledge or guidance as to how to live outside of an orphanage, their transition is not successful. Our goal is to help them avoid the traps of human trafficking and drugs by assisting them with education, spiritual training and the learning of critical life skills.

In December 2015 HIM purchased a property in Slovakia that has a 4,000 square foot house, a barn, and garage situated on just over three-quarters of an acre of land. From this location a ministry known as *New Horizons Center* is being launched to help young ladies find a personal relationship with Christ and learn how to successfully integrate into society. We are excited about the potential of the center.

- The location is perfect since it is just six miles from a larger city where the girls can find employment.
- There is excellent transportation into the city from the village.
- The property is large and has established fruit trees and grapevines.
- There is room for a sizable vegetable garden and some farm animals which will help the center become self-sustaining.

A Christian woman named Natasha will live in the home as its managing director. Ed Durham, regional director for HIM Europe, will serve as the executive director. He and his wife Heather continue to live and minister in Budapest, Hungary. The *New Horizons Center* will provide temporary transitional housing for those who have nowhere else to go. The center exists to *transform disadvantaged youth into well-adjusted spiritual leaders and disciple makers through education, counseling, coaching and training.* For more information on how you can partner with this ministry, contact




