

#### <u>1. WHERE DID YOU MINISTER IN AFRICA?</u> "Oshakati, Namibia"

2. HOW WAS YOUR EXPERIENCE DIFFERENT FROM LIFE AT HOME? We slept in a tent. Also, they drive on the opposite side of the road. Driving the first few days was interesting for me. Africa is becoming such a modern place that not a whole lot has to change these days. Many of the comforts of home are available here now, such as grocery stores, malls, fast food (McDonalds, KFC), wifi, and electricity.

<u>3. WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO WITNESS TO PEOPLE IN NAMIBIA?</u> I think the most valuable form of ministry would be consistent evangelism. It's going to take more than just handing someone a tract
