


AMONG **SAVAGES**

Like John Paton, many people in Bible times went through incredibly dangerous circumstances. But they showed courage and perseverance in obeying the call of God.


Unscramble the letters to find the names. Then draw a line from the hint to the correct name.

Upon their arrival an old island chief who had been friendly to John before did much to ensure the safety of the Patons. Because of this chief's protection, the savages became very respectful of Paton and his work.

The natives could not read or write. One day while building their house, John needed some tools. He wrote a note on a piece of bark and asked the chief to take it to his wife. She read the note and gave the tools to the chief. The old chief demanded that Paton explain how his wife heard the bark talk. This opened the way to teach the chief how to read, using the Bible as a textbook.

He and his wife began orphanages and provided shelter for lost children. Maggie started classes for young women, teaching them how to sew, sing, and read. Before long the natives began to openly receive the gospel.

Soon the majority of the former savages gave their lives to Jesus Christ. Paton played a part in translating the Bible into their native language so they could read the Scriptures and continue to spread the word of God.

No, the path John Paton walked was not easy—far from it. But he knew the call God had given him, and he followed it with unwavering faith and determination. Because he diligently pursued God's plan, souls are in heaven today who otherwise would have fallen into hell. And he did so not for personal gain but for the glory of God.
