SLOVAKIAN CHRISTMAS TRADITION

For Slovaks, the Christmas season begins early with Advent, lots of preparation, and St. Nicholas's Day on

December 6. Fish is the meat of choice for the all-important Christmas Eve dinner, and live carp can be purchased from big tanks on the streets and in stores. Often the fish are purchased early and kept alive in a family's bathtub until Christmas Eve. The children play with them, and when a shower or bath is needed, the fish are put in a bucket temporarily. On Christmas Eve Baby Jesus is credited with delivering the presents. Christmas trees are put up close to Christmas, and they stay up until after January 6, which is Epiphany or the Feast of the Three Kings.



I think my favorite time around here is when the hen house is all settled down for the night, and suddenly we hear peals of laughter rolling across the yard from the girls' home. That is when we know it is game night, and everyone is having a good time. I am glad the girls can spend time with Sharron and Tim, because they are good folks. And now, my friend, I must go.
