Oh, what great memories we made together as we traveled to sixty-six churches, two missions conventions, and one revival during our sevenmonth furlough. It was so good to reconnect with churches and donors and to give them a fresh update of what God is doing in Honduras and throughout Latin America. God provided generously for our van project and also for the Latin America general fund. Thank the Lord!

In August we found ourselves in Florida helping, Joseph get his studies started at Bible college! He is majoring in education and has a burden to hopefully someday start a school on a mission field. The first few weeks were a little bit of an adjustment, but he has adapted very well, and God is really working in his life. In September we were part of a missions convention in Independence, Kansas, and in October we were part of a missions convention at Hobe Sound Bible College. We were encouraged to see young people seeking God's will and answering the call to missions. The needs are so great and the laborers so few.

Before returning to the field, Hannah and I were privileged to minister for about ten days in the country of Egypt. Pastor Shenouda opened his home and church for us to come along with Jose Cancio to share with his people. He has a good number of Sudanese refugees attending his church. We also had a special three-day seminar in Cairo with a group of about thirty-five people on the topic of holiness. God blessed our time together greatly!

At the end of November we returned to Honduras. We were happy to be home and thankful for our church leaders who faithfully served during our absence. We were joyfully surprised to see new people attending. The leaders had showed maturity and unity. Praise the Lord, it had been a good learning experience for them.

If you hosted us, prayed for us, gave to us, fed us, or just followed our journey, we want to say a big thank you. This was one of our best furloughs ever! God supplied our every need, and we returned to the field excited to see what lies ahead.

We were blessed to have Pastor Hery Santiago and a team from his church come at the beginning of the year to do ministry and to be a part of our youth retreat. They got the necessary donations to be able to buy 150 pairs of new clogs for many of the families at the dump. They also handed out soup to everyone. It felt like Christmas watching them get so excited to receive their shoes. There were lots of smiles and happy hearts!

The team did a fantastic job participating in the youth retreat. They divided up into different teams and took part in the activities. They made many new friends with our young people. They fit right in as nearly all of them spoke Spanish and some were bilingual. Hery Santiago was also our special speaker at the youth camp. God used him

Mission Helps sent a powerhouse team of twelve guys to install a metal roof on one of our HIM churches in Tacaná, Guatemala. We joined up with them to help with translating. These guys had it down pat and welded the rafters, installed the roof, and made a metal banister on the front of the church in just three and a half days! Pastor Cruz and his congregation were so thrilled! He said it would have taken probably a month to do what this team did.

This church has been working hard to finish this two-story building. They have been holding services on the first floor, where they have a kitchen and rooms. Now they will have access to the entire top floor where the main sanctuary will be. The people thanked them over and over for their hard work and gave them each a little souvenir from Guatemala. What a blessing!

While we were in the country, we were able to visit two other HIM churches and preach in their services. God is definitely helping the works there, and we praise Him for the advancements in His kingdom. The San Marcos church is growing, and they recently started Bible institute classes for their leaders. Praise God for what He is doing!

Thump, thump. It was the sound nobody wants to hear on a long road trip. Our back tire had blown out as we were nearing San Salvador on our return from Guatemala. It was a four-lane highway, and we were coming down a steep incline. It would be dangerous to try to change a tire in those conditions. We had to find a safe place to pull off.

The first chance I got, I turned onto a dirt road and tried to find a level place to park. As soon as I pulled onto the road, we saw two-tattooed men sitting on the left and two or three other men standing on the right at the entrance to the road. "Oh no" Hannah said, "These guys could be gang members, and

we just drove into their territory." There was nothing I could do. We were at their mercy. I got out and opened the trunk of our car to get the tools and spare, showing to everyone all our suitcases and things we were traveling with. The men started gathering around our car. We were nervous and praying. Would they take advantage of us?

Before long one of the men grabbed the wrench and started loosening the lug nuts. Another got the jack and started placing it under the car. Within a short time the spare was on, and the old tire was in our trunk. We were so thankful that whom we thought were gang members ended up being angels in disguise! They did not even want paid for their service! God is good, and we are very thankful for His daily protection!

A Week of Ministry

The first full week of March was jammed packed with ministry. March 3-6 we were at the Bus and Outreach Convention in Westfield, Indiana. The Lord helped Hannah and I share a session on, "What Ministry Workers Need to Hear." I also preached the nightly services. It was a time to be challenged to do more to win souls!
