A little over seven years ago my family and I became missionaries with Hope International Missions to serve the orphans in Lesotho, Africa. As we stepped out in faith, we believed that the God who had called us would be faithful to complete the vision He had planted within our hearts. God kept His promise, and we are grateful for the two terms we served overseas. When God began to draw our attention to the needs of our children because of their age, we prayed God would open doors for continued ministry when we returned from Africa. It is encouraging to watch God's plan unfold as I take on the position in Hobe Sound as the Director of Public Relations for FEA Ministries.

As I reflect on my childhood as a missionary kid and the years my family served in Africa, I am humbled by the privilege and opportunity I have had of cross-cultural ministry. I see this new role as a fresh endeavor to continue serving in missions, something I am passionate about, and I approach it with a deep desire to reflect God's glory in my life.

Theme: To the Ends of the Earth

Each year Hope International Missions introduces a new theme on Missions Day during Sea Breeze Camp. The theme this year was, "To the Ends of the Earth." When reflecting on what that means, it brought back memories of a small village in Africa only thirteen miles from where I lived. By the time we drove an hour and twenty minutes to arrive at Ha Ratau, it really felt like the end of the earth. The lack of electricity and running water in the village's homes became a reminder of how significantly apart we were from this village in spite of how close we lived. But good news came to that remote village in June 2024 when the first church building there was finished and dedicated.

Acts 1:8 says, "But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you, and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth" (ESV).

While the author of Acts had no knowledge of a village in Africa called Ha Ratau, God did, and in God's time the light of the gospel pierced through that village's darkness. The light of Christ is still changing lives and reaching out to the ends of the earth.

During the Singing Christmas Tree program here in Hobe Sound this past December, I was asked to play the part of the prophet Micah. Night after night I stood on the stage and recited this powerful prophesy regarding the birth of Jesus. Once I was able to get past the discomfort of the costume, the glare of the bright lights, and the fear of forgetting my lines, the truth of these powerful words began to impact me in ways I had never previously considered.

The phrase "ends of the earth" appears often in Scripture, and a brief study reveals different applications. In Isaiah we are reminded it is God who created the ends of the earth. Zechariah proclaims God will rule the ends of the earth, and in 1 Samuel we learn God will judge the ends of the earth. Creator, Ruler, Judge—words that communicate the power and awesomeness of God. Words that bring fear to the hearts and minds of those who are lost!

But as we continue to search out this phrase in Scripture, we also learn the ends of the earth will see the salvation of God. We find that Gentiles will come to God from the ends of the earth. And as the prophet Micah says, "He shall be great to the ends of the earth; And this One shall be peace."

Yes, God is Creator, Ruler, and Judge, but He also brings salvation, hope, and peace! What a mighty God we serve. What a beautiful message we have to share—to the ends of the earth!



HIM AFRICA

GOD IS AT WORK

Whether leading a child to Christ, helping start a new Afrikaans church in South Africa, or sharing the gospel with a clinic patient, HIM Africa missionaries find that our most fruitful ministries are when we participate in something the Holy Spirit is already doing.

In May 2024 Africa 85 held a pastoral training seminar in Rwanda. Through a series of providential events Emmanuel, a young evangelist from Uganda, was sent by his denomination to attend this seminar. Throughout 2024 God had been at work in their denomination, calling them back from a false prosperity gospel that offered salvation without repentance or separation from sin. The true gospel God was leading these pastors to live and preach was so foreign to their church members and the world around them that even the leaders were a little uncertain of themselves.

At the seminar in Rwanda, Emmanuel was deeply moved by the message of holiness he heard and begged us to come to Uganda and help their denomination with a similar training seminar. Months of planning and preparation resulted in Stephanie and Glenn Gault and Allegri Parmigren

(an Africa 85 trainer from Zambia) traveling to this pastor's church at the Rwamwanja Refugee Camp in western Uganda. Even though we did not know how God was working in their church, we felt clearly led to use lessons from the Shepherds Global Classroom course, Doctrine and Practice of a Holy Life, to demonstrate how to use this curriculum to train the next generation of pastors. The Holy Spirit worked powerfully through these lessons, as well as sermons we preached, to confirm biblical holiness in the minds of the host pastors. As a result of the Spirit working through us, their ministry theme has become, "The Church changing the world, not the world changing the Church."





HIM ASIA

LEARNING IN A CULTURE OF CHRISTIANITY

I began my year in Mongolia by finishing out a season of language study. My speaking skills have slowly improved, and I have been able to add many new words and phrases to my vocabulary for daily use. I have a long way to go to reach fluency, but I praise God for His continual help in this area.

During that time, I was connected to the first Mongolian ACE school, a wonderful ministry opportunity. The director is Oyuna. Her passion is to provide Christian education for the many children of Christian parents who are themselves young in faith. She told me, "Their parents are still learning about God, and they don't know how to teach their kids." Her desire for the school is to make it a place where young people learn within a culture of Christianity.

I was invited to be a lead teacher over the Christian curriculum. After completing a supervisor's training course during the summer, I returned to Mongolia to begin teaching in September. This year the school has about 130 students from grades 1-11. Most are from Christian homes, but approximately 30 percent of the students come from non-believing families. This dynamic creates challenges—but it also brings beautiful possibilities. A professing Satanist asked sincere questions about my beliefs. A student invited an atheist classmate to their Christmas service. A young man wrote his first sermon for a school competition. God is moving and working in these students' lives.

Through unexpected challenges, discipline issues, and even severe illness, God has continually provided. We appreciate the prayer and encouragement of the home office, supporters, and church family. Many difficulties and needs remain, but I am trusting God will provide for each in His own time.

Valera and Maude Motovilov consistently point the atheistic young adults in Czechia toward a relationship with God. It is encouraging that several are seeking answers and have come to their Bible studies. Wesley and Janna Cressman are piercing the spiritual darkness in Spain as they minister to women, children, and homeless people. Benjamin and Jaylena McDowell are preparing to go to Armenia in August of this year.

Two of the highlights of the past year for me were a ministry weekend in June with Wesley and Debbie Holden in Spain and an outreach at a motorcycle rally in Austria in September. It was the culmination of months of planning and preparation. Flashes of pain hit Roberto's ribs like bolts of lightning. His father was jabbing him with a broom stick as he lay hiding under a bed, fearing for his life. Sixteen-year-old Roberto had enough of his drunken father's rages and physical abuse and was determined to run away from home, never to come back to Las Delicias. He did not care if he ever saw his father again.

The next morning he ran down the path, holding a little bundle of clothes, and caught the bus to Tegucigalpa. He was finally free! For the next several months Roberto lived on the streets, eating out of garbage cans, drinking water from people's hoses, and getting kicked from one place to another. He longed for someone to love him, someone to care.


As years went by, Roberto's life continued to spiral out of control. He was now married with two daughters, but his marriage was falling apart. When we first met him, we invited him and his wife, Jenny, to attend a marriage seminar at our church. They came and received help but then continued attending our church. God was dealing with their hearts. Roberto's father in the meantime had become a Christian and had changed his life. He tried to rebuild at least a friendship with his son, but Roberto's heart continued to have much hurt and resentment.

One evening as I concluded a message about

Abraham sacrificing Isaac, Roberto came forward to lay his "Isaac" down and gave his heart to Christ. Weeping and broken, he surrendered his life and found peace with God. He began to walk in the light and grow in grace. After several years he told us that he felt God calling him to pastor the church in Las Delicias, the village to which he never wanted to return. He would also be working with his father, whom he hated for so many years. However, he and his father reconciled and asked forgiveness for all the hurt they had caused one another. For the past twelve years they have worked side by side at the church.

Recently Roberto excitedly told me of new families coming to the church. Just a few weeks ago two entire families came forward to give their hearts to Jesus! On a recent visit to the church I was blessed to see these new converts worshiping God and passionately involved in ministry. I could not help but think back to Roberto's story and how God brought it full circle and is now using him to share God's love in a place that used to be such a source of pain. God is good, and may His name be praised unto the ends of the earth!

THE ENDS OF THE EARTH HAVE COME TO US

Reflecting over what God accomplished in 2024 across HIM North America causes deep gratitude to well up in our hearts. Truly He is working in miraculous ways to draw men and women to Himself!

Immigration in the United States is unprecedented by any other country in the world. One fifth of the world's international immigrants call the United States home. These people flock to our nation from around the globe, but a recent trend has brought them pouring in from Asia and Latin America. Over fourteen percent of America's population now consists of these immigrants. Truly the ends of the earth have settled in our own backyard.

For decades HIM has endeavored to reach Hispanics here in America with the gospel. The fruit of these efforts is visible in a growing number of thriving churches scattered up the Eastern seaboard and across the Midwest. Our missionaries have faithfully worked with Asians from China and Taiwan, especially through our partnership with the Palm Beach Chinese Christian Chapel in West Palm Beach, Florida. Immigrants to America are hungry souls, seeking

a better life and a greater dream. Many come from

wartorn countries. Some flee persecution, genocide, or a collapsing nation wrecked with poverty. An example of the cross-section of nationalities with whom our missionaries are ministering includes people from Syria, Palestine, Jordan, Lebanon, Yemen, Iraq, Turkey, Egypt, Afghanistan, Kuwait, Tunisia, Pakistan, Mauritania, and Morocco. Men and women from each of these countries have registered as students in our English-training facility in Dearborn, Michigan. Many have faced recent tragedy in their families due to the multiple conflicts ravaging Africa and the Middle East. And by the grace of God these individuals have been lovingly confronted with the truth that their only hope is found in Jesus Christ. This occurs while having a specific need (learning to speak English) met through classes taught on a weekly basis at our ministry center.

Amish in Central Pennsylvania, whose religion keeps them from biblical truth, have a missionary working diligently to love them to Jesus. Hispanic young people are being discipled and are clearly growing in their faith. We praise God for real spiritual victories won across HIM North America last year and ask Him for greater fruit in 2025!

HIM US SPANISH MINISTRIES

RELATIONAL AND REPRODUCIBLE RECRUITMENT

Three of life's greatest joys can be experienced fully in the plan of God: the joy of salvation, joy in marriage, and joy in the birth of another human being. Each of these involves a radical abandonment of one status of life for another. This includes recognizing the potential in the other person to reproduce the character qualities of Christ. From Genesis to Revelation, and all history, God has been seeking men and women to become His image bearers, consequently relating, recruiting, and reproducing His lifegiving principles in others. This is best done with five practical initiatives:

Public Contact—Christians must leave the saltshaker to be the salt of the earth.

Personal Connections—Christians must intentionally connect with people of all social statuses Passionate Compassion—Christians must take the time to know the whole person to offer restorative

and enabling assistance.

Proclaiming Christ—Christians must recognize that social service without proclaiming the gospel enhances status, but it does not affect the soul.

Praying Consistently—Christians must know that all relational and reproducible recruitment is ineffective without prayer. Prayer is God's divine oxygen injected into souls.

These five approaches call for intentionality, mercy, and ministering according to the mandates of Christ. Through the guidance of the Holy Spirit, relational and reproducible recruitment takes place.

Pablo Macario was attending the Instituto Bíblico Evangélico. A year before graduating, he was hindered from finishing. Eventually his situation was resolved. He has now graduated, married, and is praying about going to Mount Olive, North Carolina, to shepherd a group of believers. These Christians are from the HIM church in Motozintla, Chiapas, Mexico. Hopefully they will soon establish a new church plant.

Several years ago a family migrated to the US from Guatemala. The mother, a believer, soon found a holiness church to attend. Later her family of eight joined her on this journey of faith. Her oldest daughter married a fellow Guatemalan whom God called to be a pastor. They both studied and graduated from the Instituto Bíblico Evangélico. Recently God spoke to them about a place in South Carolina for churchplanting. They are now embarking on a journey to spread God's kingdom.

As 2025 unfolds, God is directing HIM US Spanish Ministries to minister to the Hispanic people holistically, especially as they face the uncertainty of massive deportations. When their compatriots go through valleys and hard roads while seeking a better life, these Christians intersect with divine grace. God's emissaries pause to minister so everyone is cared for—physically, socially, spiritually, emotionally, and morally.

HIM US Spanish Ministries is resolute in ensuring that every Hispanic person is given the opportunity to know Christ. Consequently the churches realize that ministry is not just a socio-cultural pat on the back that pronounces superficial salvation. "God bless you" means, "God be with you and establish you spiritually." The process that begins before conversion continues in born-again believers who progress in fellowship, friendship, and fruitfulness. Eventually each disciple becomes one of the relational, reproducible recruits who extend the purposes of Christ in their sphere of influence.


