In August we were able to take a few days away from ministry for a family vacation. The highlight was visiting Philip and Amrie Geise and their family (left), where they minister in South Africa. We also visited the Kruger National Park (right) and Eswatini (formerly Swaziland).

HIM's eleven churches in Lesotho and South Africa are divided into circuits with a senior pastor over each circuit. Less experienced pastors and lay leaders help the senior

pastors fill pulpits each Sunday. I normally help Rev. Kali Nthabi with his circuit of five churches. Recently the pastors agreed to mix things up a bit in September and visit churches at which they seldom or never preach. As part of this program, I visited HIM's newest church plant at Ha Hlalele. Brother Mpheteng, the lay pastor (right) who lives next to the church, shared an encouraging testimony of how God is helping him provide for his



family through a variety of odd jobs, while still being available for ministry whenever needed. Besides caring for his own family, he is helping some relatives who are orphaned.

We say a big thank you for your prayers and support that made it possible for both Glenn and

Stephanie to join Africa 85 and Shepherds Global Classroom in Egypt to introduce church leaders to SGC (left and right). We were so encouraged by the missionary vision of the Egyptian church, and we are excited about possible future opportunities to help train pastors in other North African countries!

A Trip to Rwanda and Zambia

Through a painful but providential series of events, Rev. Allegri (right), Africa 85's coordinator in Zambia, was relocated back to his home country of Rwanda early this year. He is very disappointed to find his native country becoming increasingly secular and godless. He also is recognizing a deep hunger for truth and revival. At his request Glenn is going there the first week of October to explore the possibilities of starting a ministry. The Rwanda government has closed thousands of churches in the last few years because they do not meet government standards. It may be easier for an overseas mission organization like HIM to start a church than for locals to start it. Glenn and Pastor Allegri

will also meet with a pas-

tor from Burundi who wants to start using Shepherds Global Classroom to train evangelists in his country.

The team of teachers that Allegri trained in the Mayukwayukwa Refugee Camp are continuing to train ministers under the capable leadership of Rev. Angel Chipulu. On the eleventh of October the first cohort of eighteen students will graduate and receive their certificates from Columbia International University. From Rwanda Glenn will fly to Zambia to attend this big event. We celebrate these pastors' hard work. But

more than just a graduation, we are thrilled about the spiritual fruit and revival that has hap-

pened as they studied God's Word through Shepherds Global Classroom.
