Our lives—December to April

One of the most special three weeks of our lives was the time we spent with our parents and families over Christmas! We are so grateful to God and to you for your generous giving to make this precious time possible. When we said goodbye to Stephanie's dad after Christmas, we knew his health was failing, and it would likely be the last Christmas we would spend together. We did not expect him to make his journey to heaven quite so quickly. However on February 15 he did. Glenn and Kristell were in America at Sea Breeze Camp Meeting. Stephanie and Caleb flew home but arrived the day after he passed. We miss him a lot but also rejoice that he is safely home in heaven.

Africa 85 has kept us very busy organizing material, planning logistics, and teaching seminars. Glenn was supposed to go to Burkina Faso with Africa 85 to train a group of pastors to use Shepherds Global Classroom but was not able to obtain a visa with the current political climate. This trip was rescheduled to the end of February with Rev. Shema from Rwanda and Rev. Quassy from Cote D'Ivoire facilitating. In early March Maricka Herrer joined Dr. R. G. Hutchison and Dr. Randall McElwain for a seminar in Ethiopia. Some of the pastors who attended are focusing their efforts on the border areas of Ethiopia, where refugees have settled from some of the most unreached and difficult parts of Africa. President Harold Martin helped Glenn teach a seminar on marriage and family later in March in Cameroon. Rev. Shema helped with a training in Burundi right after Easter.
